




Dedication Soothes the Soul

Carol's Garden

uring the past 16 months, COVID-19 changed all our lives in so many ways. But, nothing so dramatically as in nursing homes and Beechwood was no exception. Many difficult days of illness and, at times, losses. And many difficult days for staff, caring for both our residents and their own families at home. They are true angels. Whenever we could, we would look for silver linings to get all of us through the challenges of each day and the feelings of loss and loneliness.

And we found it in the "gift" of a simple garden.

Carol Cannon lives at Beechwood Homes in Holzman House, one of three households that share a large common courtyard with gardens and two ponds with soothing waterfalls. Due to COVID visitor restrictions, our landscapers could not come into the building.

Thus, they were unable to come into the inside courtyard to work on beddings, weeds and tend to flowers, etc.

That's where Carol came to the rescue.

Carol loves to garden and as she says, "get my hands dirty!" When she saw all the weeds growing in the courtyard gardens and the poor condition of the beds, she asked Nora, a nurse in Holzman House, if she could weed and clean the beds. After a quick assessment from the occupational therapists, Carol was cleared to take on this huge undertaking. According to Carol, this is therapy for her body and soul.

That was last May 2020. Fast forward to June 2021!

The transformation has been miraculous! During the warm weather months, Carol is outside in the gardens every day working. She is a very spry and physically fit petite woman, who spends hours on her hands and knees. Carol said, "I know my limitations and ask for help if I need it. The staff stand at the door and check on me to make sure I'm ok," she laughed. Fran Angelino, neighborhood secretary in Holzman House declared, "I don't know anyone who could get down and weed for hours . . . I couldn't do it!"



A "garden club" is born.

Residents – many in wheelchairs – would ask to be taken out to watch the day to day transformation while chatting with Carol and each other. They would help paint decorative small stones and metal flowers. Staff got involved – bringing in garden décor like flags, miniature gnomes and fairies. Beechwood added flower baskets and flowers for Carol to place wherever she and the residents thought were best to enhance "bloom" in the courtyard. Lastly, solar landscape lights were placed throughout the courtyard for residents to enjoy at night.

Carol said the maintenance men are always checking in on her to see if she needs anything. "I would do anything for Carol to help her realize her dream garden," said Ed Kusmierz. Housekeeper Sam Brown – who collects the huge bags of weeds – teases Carol asking her if she is done yet?!!

When one sits in the garden you are treated to paradise. The garden has become a sanctuary through the collective effort of all. It is a labor of love and provides joy and peace during a very tumultuous time.

During this interview with Carol, we had many visitors stop by including staff and residents. Everyone wanted to share a story about "their" beautiful garden and how grateful they were to Carol for her "gift of life." As we were chatting, there were blue jays, cardinals, finches, robins and wrens singing and flying from tree to tree. Then the resident family of ducks stopped by and waddled right over to Carol. They seem to think Carol is their mother!

In honor of Carol's hard work and the true gift she has given all of us...a dedication and blessing was held where residents, staff and several of Carol's family members were in attendance. Together Rich McCune, administrator and Ken Keenan, director of pastoral care spoke of the heartwarming impact that this garden has had in bringing us together.

In recognition, a plaque has been placed under the large maple tree noting "Carol's Garden."
