Dear Friends,



Over the last year, Beechwood Continuing Care has actively pursued organizational opportunities which position our Homes to serve a greater role in the provision of residential and health care services. I would like to update you on what we have accomplished and share some of what we all look forward to in 2021:

The Year 2020

I want to acknowledge and express my sincere thanks and appreciation for the extraordinary dedication of our managers and staff throughout the pandemic. They are all HEROES!

Each level of care has faced its own challenges but all staff has approached each and every day with our mission in mind – the physical, emotional and spiritual well-being of our residents is always of first and foremost importance.

Everyone at Beechwood Continuing Care has been overwhelmed by the public displays of support from the families of our residents and from the entire community. The generous donations of food, gift cards and heartfelt signs of thanks to all staff have been truly amazing and greatly appreciated!

The regulatory protocols restricting visitors into our homes have been so difficult for residents, families, friends, and staff to accept. As the vaccination effort continues, our hope is renewed for better days ahead.



In spite of the pandemic, Beechwood Continuing Care has continued to persevere on several longstanding strategic objectives – continuing to challenge our existing care model where appropriate and actively pursuing new partnerships to ensure sustainability of the organization going forward.

Blocher Homes

As we all know, faced with a long-term decrease in occupancy rates, Blocher Homes has made the judicious operational decision to partner with People Inc. to repurpose the property and develop mixed income independent living apartments in the Village of Williamsville.



The proposed plan not only addresses a defined need for this type of housing in our community but, importantly, it is an alternative use for the property that is consistent with the original intent of John and Elizabeth Blocher's donation in the early 1900's.

By continuing to work with those Blocher residents who transitioned to our newly renovated wing at Beechwood, we hope to ultimately create the quality living environment they desire with the added benefit of being able to receive the extra nursing and medical care needed – onsite and in the comfort of their own “home” – ideally avoiding unnecessary hospitalizations too often experienced at the assisted living level of care.

Presbyterian Senior Care of WNY

Back in 2019 we announced that Presbyterian Senior Care of Western New York (PSCWNY) and Beechwood Continuing Care had reached an agreement on terms in which the PSCWNY communities and properties would become a part of our continuum. The PSCWNY facilities to be added to our service line include Ken-Ton Presbyterian Village senior apartments located in Kenmore, Presbyterian Village at North Church senior apartments located in Williamsville, and the Lockport Presbyterian Home.

I'm happy to report that last year we completed the time-consuming process of applying for and obtaining regulatory approval for this asset transfer from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, New York Attorney General, and New York State Department of Health. We are currently working with legal counsel and our banking partners to officially complete this transaction – ideally in early 2021. Very exciting!

As faith-based organizations, we have shared visions, similar missions and a deep commitment to service. We both support high quality, person-centered care for individuals in whatever setting they call home. When the PSCWNY facilities officially become part of our organization we will finally be able to implement and realize the benefits of achieving strategic and operational alignment.

This is a tremendous opportunity – combining the unique strengths of both organizations to better address the emerging residential and health care needs of seniors in our community. Together we will have an even greater impact in Western New York – touching more lives and fostering innovative practices in service delivery across our expanded continuum of care.

Accepting change and being proactive in challenging times has been and still is imperative to Beechwood's success. Thanks to the vision of the Board of Directors and the commitment to excellence of all staff the future remains bright.

What is your Legacy?

Myths of Legacy Giving

Myth: Legacy giving donors are wealthy.

Reality: Legacy gifts are generally from donors of modest means who cannot afford to give an outright gift of any substantial size to their favorite organization

Myth: Legacy giving donors are old.

Reality: Nearly 1/3 of the existing donors are younger than 65, and 6% are younger than 45.

Charitable Bequests

A charitable bequest is simply a distribution from your estate to a charitable organization through your last will and testament. There are different kinds of bequests. For each, you must use very specific language to indicate the precise direction of your assets, and to successfully carry out your final wishes. In any charitable bequest, be sure to name the recipient accurately.

Below, we have listed some of the more common kinds of bequests, and some bequest language. We always recommend that you carefully review the terms of your will with a professional trained in handling trusts and estates.

General Bequests are legacies left to certain people or causes that come from the general value of the estate, and are made by designating a specific dollar amount, a particular asset or a fixed percentage of your estate to the cause of your choice. General bequest language:

“I give, devise, and bequeath to Beechwood/Blocher Foundation, the sum of \$_____ to be used as the board of directors deem the need is greatest.”

Specific Bequests are made when a particular item or property is bequeathed for a designated purpose. (i.e., funds to provide musical entertainment for our residents.) Specific bequest language:

“I give, devise, and bequeath the sum of \$_____ (or a description of a specific asset), for the benefit of the Beechwood/Blocher Foundation to be used for the following purpose: (state the purpose). If at any time in the judgment of the trustees of the Beechwood/Blocher Foundation it is impossible or impracticable to carry out exactly the designated purpose, they shall determine an alternative purpose closest to the designated purpose.”

Residuary Bequests are made when you intend to leave the residue portion of your assets after other terms of the will have been satisfied. Residuary bequest language:

“All the rest, residue, and remainder of my estate, both real and personal, I give to the Beechwood/Blocher Foundation for its general purposes.”

Contingency Bequests allow you to leave a portion of your estate to a particular charity if your named beneficiary does not survive you. Contingency bequest language:

“I give and bequeath the residue of the property, real and personal and wherever situated, owned by me at my death, to (name of beneficiary), if (she/he) survives me. If (name of beneficiary) does not survive me, I devise and bequeath my residuary estate to the Beechwood/Blocher Foundation, for its general purposes.”

Without a will, there is no mechanism in place to make a bequest, so here are the steps you should take to make sure your wishes are granted.

- **Make a list of organizations or causes that you would like to support.**
- **Make a detailed list of your assets (financial, real estate, vehicles, jewelry, collectibles, musical instruments, etc.)**
- **Set up an appointment with your financial analyst or attorney; or planned giving officer at the organization you intend to support. These professionals will help sensitively guide you through the process.**

Charitable Gifts Through Your IRA or Appreciated Stock Can Provide Significant Tax Benefits

IRA Charitable Rollover Provides Great Tax Benefits –

Did you know the Charitable IRA Rollover allows individuals 70 ½ years of age or older to transfer up to \$100,000 of tax-free gifts from their IRA to their favorite charity. In light of the recent changes in the tax laws, this can be a significant incentive for donors to sustain their charitable contributions and experience tax benefits.

You Can Give More When Donating Your Appreciated Stocks

Make a bigger impact by donating long-term appreciated securities, including stock, bonds, and mutual funds, directly to charity. Compared with donating cash, or selling your appreciated securities and contributing the after-tax proceeds, you may be able to automatically increase your gift and your tax deduction.

Given that the Dow Jones Industrial Average rose from about 18,000 at the end of March 2015 to over 30,000 at the end of December 2020, you are likely to realize a taxable profit on the sale of assets you purchased in the past five years. But if you donate the stock directly to a charity, there's no capital gains tax to pay.

It's simple and easy. When you donate stock to charity, you'll generally take a tax deduction for the full fair market value. No one could have predicted the arrival of COVID-19 and the devastation it would inflict on our communities and around the globe. We have mourned those we have lost and celebrated those who have recovered. And due to COVID, new resident Medicaid applications are presently not being processed – thus adding to our growing loss of revenue for Beechwood at this time.

Lastly, it is likely that New York State will propose more cuts that will have a severe impact on Beechwood as well as other skilled nursing homes in the state. Beechwood has always been able to count on generous support from our families, friends and community . . . and we need your help more than ever before.

We are so thankful for past donations to our Foundation. Without support from individuals like you, Beechwood will be unable to continue to provide the extraordinary home environment, programs and services that our residents and their families have come to enjoy.

COVID RELIEF FUND

These unrestricted donations can be dedicated by the Foundation board to emerging needs within the Homes . . . whether they support operations or for program or fund support.


