Dear Family Members/Responsible Parties:

I want to provide a brief COVID update for everyone at this time. We have had no new resident cases since the last update, but we did have two (2) non direct care staff test positive yesterday. They did not have any resident contact so no surveillance testing is required and there will be no change to visitation.

Please remember that we have compiled the facility visitation guidelines into a single reference sheet that is available at the screening tables and on our website. Face masks (source control) and social distancing remain NY State requirements, and I respectfully ask all to comply while visiting your loved ones. Our vaccine clinics continue on Thursdays for new admissions and staff, and we continue to maintain strong overall vaccination numbers. You will notice a dramatic difference to the up-to-date percentages because the definition has now been updated based on the recent CDC recommendations which state that you must have the new bivalent booster vaccine when eligible (which is two (2) months after completion of the primary vaccine series) in order to be considered up-to-date. Many staff have had one and/or two booster doses thus far and we are working to provide additional education in regards to the benefits of receiving this new bivalent vaccine. For that reason, you will see a drop in those numbers for Beechwood and other averages. The current facility rates are as follows:

The facility has a good supply of at-home test kits available for visitors as needed, and just request at the reception/screening tables. Again, I understand the frustrations with the continued protocols that have to be followed in nursing homes but no place else in NY State, and look forward to our elected officials and the DOH updating the protocols to be consistent with the remainder of society. Regardless, it is important for all of us to remain vigilant in following the infection control precautions in place—utilization of the facility-provided surgical masks, maintaining proper social distance throughout your visit, and having proof of your negative test result. It is important for all of us to remain diligent with following these guidelines. In addition, if you are feeling sick or have any symptom associated with COVID then please stay home and do not come to the facility.
